Snow / ice / wet leaves	✓	✓	✓	1	3	Med	All	Saltburn Skatepark & Sport CIC does not have resources / manpower to grit / brush the area on a daily basis – it is a public area and so will not be closed off to users – users' responsibility is paramount, and users do so at their own risk. The Council (RCBC) will complete weekly safety checks of the park to remove any harmful objects and alert the management group to any issues which need immediate remedy.

Injury from equipment failure	✓	✓	✓	3	5	Med	RCBC	Weekly inspections from RCBC and annual RoSPA trained inspections. Actions identified will be carried out within 30 days of notification. Immediate reporting of issues to the management group by members of the public, Parish Council who are carrying out the weekly safety checks and any other professional or person who identifies a concern. Safety notice requests any person with an injury to report to the management group. They can do this by following the link (QR code) to the webpage in order to do this. The committee have an accident book and will record all accidents accordingly Details of local hospitals and urgent care centre are listed on signage	
Vandalism/ graffiti/anti	✓	✓	✓	3	5	High	PC	Police to be informed immediately by members of the public / Cllrs / Saltburn Skatepark CIC. In the event of vandalism, the area may be blocked off until rectified/offensive graffiti	
Dog excrement	✓	✓	✓	1	1	Low	All	Safety Notices to be displayed asking dogs to be kept out of the area.	
Child Welfare	✓	✓	✓	1	5	High	SSP & S CIC	Any reports of strange behaviour and or concerns relating to children being at risk of harm from people (this could be emotional, physical, and sexual harm) to be reported to Police immediately by the person who has identified the risk and includes drug misuse / drug	
Emergency Contact	✓	✓	✓	1	5	Med	SSP & S CIC	An emergency telephone number / email address /will be made known to all user skatepark users. This will be accessible via the QR code on the safety signs. Two Committee members will respond to any reports in order to follow the safeguarding procedure whereby we will never work with a child on a 1:1 basis	

First Aid Provision	✓	✓	✓	Injury / accident	1	3	Med	PC / PN	The nearest defibrillator is outside the Co op on Marske Road for users of the Skatepark. Saltburn Athletic Club have a First Aid provision/responders, but this is only available when access to the club is available, this is usually only during the football season or when football training is taking place, which varies from week to week. If any member of the public who uses the Skatepark requires first aid treatment it will be their responsibility to seek this provision based on the severity of the injury. In the event of a serious injury an ambulance should be called by the person injured or another member of the public. The ambulance has access to a car park which is in close distance to the Skatepark to treat the casualty.

This will be done on an annual basis and whenever an incident provides evidence that a reappraisal is necessary.
Noise pollution / antisocial behaviour	✓	✓	✓	Complaints of noise / nuisance	1	3	Low	All	Skatepark users are expected to be aware of their responsibilities for their activities in accordance with general common sense and expected appropriate use of gear/equipment. Users who fail to use the equipment in what would be termed unreasonable behaviour may be refused use of the Skatepark. This could result in law enforcement authorities called in. Users should be reminded the Skatepark is there for sporting activities and public use e.g., exercising and enjoyment. Alcohol should not be consumed at the Skatepark. Any group events at the Skatepark, excluding day to day public use, which are not organised by the Skatepark & Sport CIC will be strictly prohibited.

This report should be made to Police on 101 or 999. Users should leave the skatepark to ensure they are not harmed by the behaviour of others. Any incidents/injury should also be reported to the committee by using the QR code on the signs at the park.
Motorised vehicles	✓	✓	✓	Injury, cuts, grazes, falling, serious illness, possible death	2	5	High	All	It is users responsibility to adhere to the rules of the skatepark and for the public/CIC members to report any motorised vehicle use on the skatepark as this will cause a risk to others. This report should be made to Police on 101 or 999. Users should leave the skatepark to ensure they are not harmed by the behaviour of others. Any incident or injury should be reported to the committee by using the QR code on the signs at the park.
