Saltburn Athletic Club have a First Aid provision/responders, but this is only available when access to the club is available, this is usually only during the football season or when football training is taking place, which varies from week to week. If any member of the public who uses the Skatepark requires first aid treatment it will be their responsibility to seek this provision based on the severity of the injury. In the event of a serious injury an ambulance should be called by the person injured or another member of the public. The ambulance has access to a car park which is in close distance to the Skatepark to treat the casualty. |

Users should be reminded the Skatepark is there for sporting activities and public use e.g., exercising and enjoyment. Alcohol should not be consumed at the Skatepark. Any group events at the Skatepark, excluding day to day public use, which are not organised by the Skatepark \& Sport CIC will be strictly prohibited. |
